He was referring to not only the numerous equipment hit during Hurricane Earl, but also the recent failure of WIVH's St. Thomas translator which broadcasts WIVH over 92.7 F.M. This translator was installed several years ago and rounds- out WIVH's signal in St. Thomas. A good deal of St. Thomas is covered by WIVH's primary signal on F.M. 89.9 and in fact coverage is better since the improvements recently made. However, listeners there must become aware of the change to a new location on the dial.

Steve Johnson, a St. Thomas resident volunteers his service in keeping the translator up and operating. The unit has been returned to the manufacturer for repairs. It is hoped to be operating again, soon.
